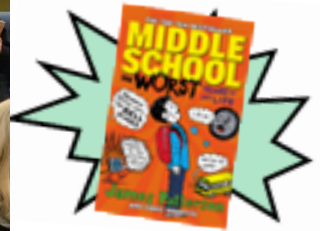

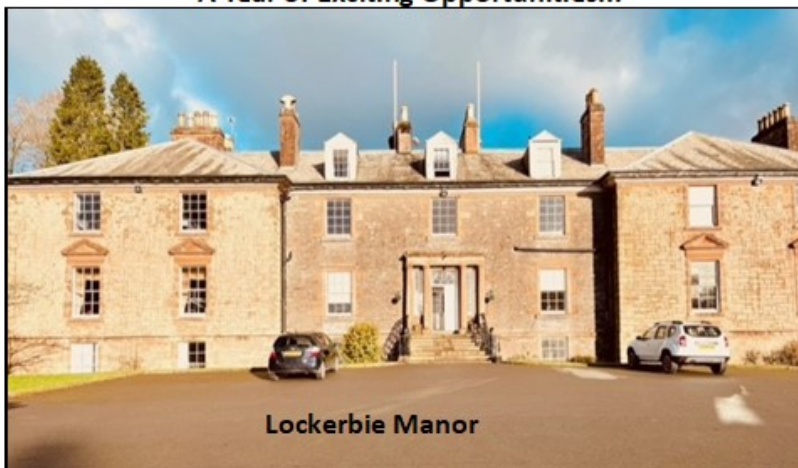

What is your favourite book to read?

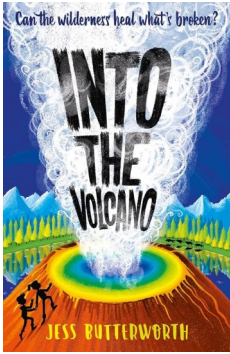
It depends what I am in the mood for. Recently I have enjoyed 'A Pinch of Magic' and 'Scythe' - two very different books!

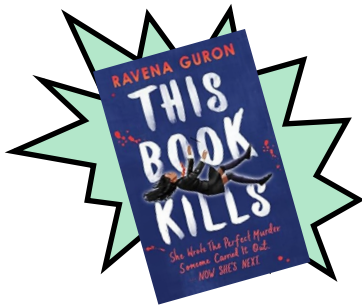
What I liked about Into The Volcano was that it was adventurous and exciting because the characters went everywhere. I think people over the age of 7+ would enjoy it if they liked adventure.

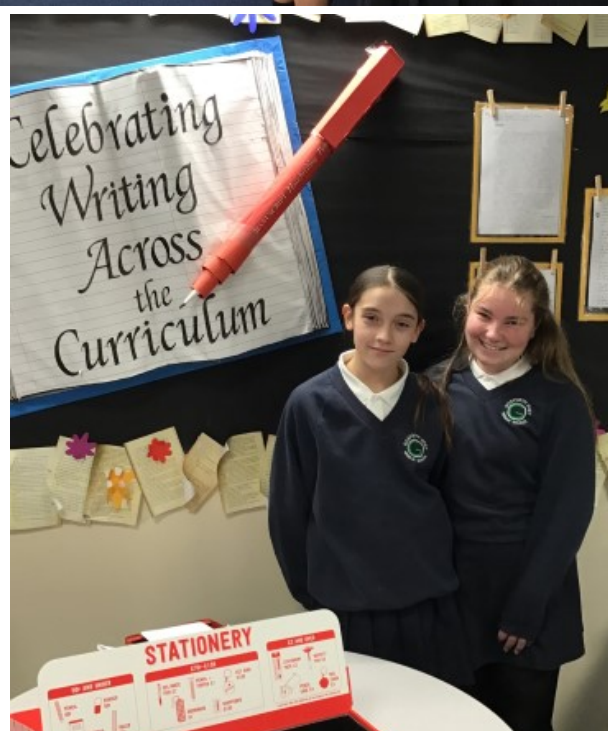
BOOK FAIR

It was fantastic to see pupils already reading the books they had chosen as they walked away from the fair.

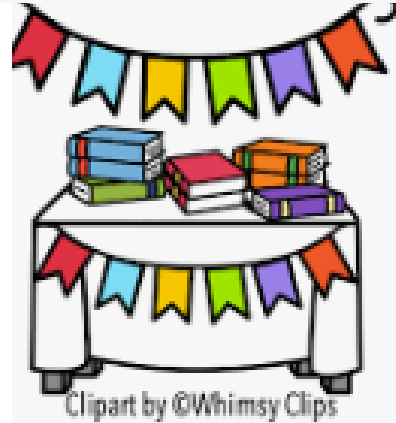


The book fair will return in the Spring!
